## 2019 EXPERIENCE ISRAEL TOUR

Study Guide for 3c: Shiloh



Historical background: Shiloh, a city on

a hill, is the place where God first dwelt and where the tabernacle stood for over 360 years after the Israelites conquered the land. Joshua 18, which we will study below, tells us Israel assembled in Shiloh and seven tribes received their portion of land there. It was at Shiloh where Hannah prayed for a son. God answered her prayer by giving her Samuel, and the prophet was born. As a very young child, he was dedicated to the Lord at Shiloh and raised in the Tabernacle. Shiloh was also the place God announced the destruction of Eli's family, because of sin. Eli's sons moved the ark, soon to be captured by the Philistines, from Shiloh. After its capture, Eli's two sons died and, hearing the news, Eli died as well.

	died. Eli, hearing about this sad news, died as well ( <u>1 Samuel 4:11-18</u> ).
6.	Shiloh's importance became less when the ark was taken from the tabernacle there. God forsook his
	at Shiloh, which was the tent he had set up among men (Psalm 78:60).

7. David made Jerusalem the capital city and, ultimately, the tabernacle in Shiloh was forsaken



(<u>Jeremiah 26:1-5</u>). The prophet Jeremiah reminded the people in Jerusalem what happened in Shiloh. What was God's warning to His people, according to (<u>Jeremiah 7:12-15)</u>?

**Thanksgiving and Praise:** God commands us to pray (<u>1 Thessalonians 5:17</u>). Why should we pray if God does what he wants? What if God wants us to participate in His plan by praying? Hannah prayed for a son, and God answered her prayer with the birth of one of the greatest prophets known to man. What if Hannah didn't pray for a son? What if we don't pray for the peace of Jerusalem? God's plan will still move forward, but will we miss out on His blessings? Let's participate in His plan (<u>Psalm 122:6</u>)!

## **Digging Deeper:**

Did you know Jerusalem has not always been the capital of Israel? Indeed, when the Israelites came into the land, Shiloh became the first center of worship before the first Temple was built in Jerusalem?

The Tabernacle was the portable dwelling place of the Ark of the Covenant. A detailed description of the making of the tabernacle is in the book of <u>Exodus 25-27</u>. Later the Ark was placed in a structure built in Shiloh where the children of Israel assembled together (Joshua 18:1).

Remember when Jesus spoke to the Samaritan woman? Jesus said to her, "Woman, believe me, the hour is coming when neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem will you worship the Father. <sup>22</sup> You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, for salvation is from the Jews. <sup>23</sup> But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father is seeking such people to worship him. <sup>24</sup> God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth" John 4:21-24.

When Jesus died on the cross, the veil protecting the Holy of Holies was split in two, leaving the place where God dwelt wide open. No longer was there a need to make an offering for sin, for Jesus, the perfect lamb, became that perfect sacrifice. The Holy Spirit can dwell in us.
