



Take a Stand and Make Your Voice Heard Tutorial

Section 1: The Problem

Our country is at a crossroad and headed for a showdown on January 6, 2021, when Congress is scheduled to officially certify our November 2020 election and seat a President. The question is: was the election clean and fair, or was it tainted by fraudulent activity resulting in American's votes and voices being disregarded? The impact will linger far beyond that date, so it is important to get it right!

Every God-loving American needs to be aware of what is at stake. Our Constitutional Republic hangs in the balance, and religious freedom, law and order, support for Israel, sanctity of life and godliness, in general, are all in jeopardy. The US Constitution is a "We the people" document because our government is **OF** the people, **BY** the people and **FOR** the people. That means our elected officials are there to represent us...not to rule over us as they please.

This is not about politics, but about our American Constitution. Throw out red/blue, right/left, conservative/liberal, Republican/Democrat, Trump/Biden. If we want our Constitution to stand and our voices as Americans to be heard, we cannot kick this can down the road. Our elections are a sacred right and we must "get it right," or lose faith in our electoral system. Sadly, in that case, we would be in no better position than rogue, socialist countries whose citizens have no voice. Christians, those who love righteousness and those who love America must act now by taking a stand and making our voices heard!

The reality is this: one must be **totally naïve**, **totally ignorant** or **totally evil** to truly believe there is no evidence of fraud in the November election. Examples are provided in Section 2 below.

This is not the first time our country has been in significant trouble, so we can glean from past history. Early on, brave men followed George Washington as he marched them bare footed through snow, then crossed the frigid Delaware River in order to save our country. Abraham Lincoln navigated a nasty Civil War in order to save our country and bring freedom to all. US forces followed Franklin D Roosevelt's commands when Pearl Harbor was attacked, ultimately saving our country. People and strong leaders have led our country to victory in its darkest days, and it's time to do it again!

Our votes in the November 2020 election were disregarded, so we must take a stand and make our voices heard now! It is time to fight for our Constitutional Republic and the integrity of our elections.

Section 2: The Details

Which states were affected?

- Investigatory efforts have focused primarily on 6 states...Arizona, Georgia, Michigan, Nevada, Pennsylvania and Wisconsin...though similar evidence has been found in other states as well.

What are examples of evidence of fraudulent voter activity?

- Dead people cast ballots
- Voters who have not lived in a particular state for years cast ballots in that state
- Illegal immigrants cast ballots
- In some states, mail-in ballots were sent to everyone, regardless of whether or not they requested absentee ballots
- Some people received (and voted) multiple ballots
- Some precincts had more votes cast than registered voters
- No records of existence are found for some people who received (and voted) absentee ballots
- Government office addresses were used as primary and secondary addresses of some who requested mail-in ballots
- Votes “disappeared” in transit from voter rolls of those who voted to Records’ offices
- Voted ballots were trucked in from one state to another
- Voters were allowed to vote beyond the date of the election
- State courts allowed last-minute changes to voting rules without authority to do so
- Vote counting stopped in the middle of the night in several states, resulting in sudden and extreme changes (100’s of thousands of votes) in vote tallies once counting resumed
- “Backdoor” entryways into voting machines enabled votes to be changed completely or “weighted”

Those are big allegations. What evidence backs up those allegations?

- [A forensic audit of voting machines in Antrim County MI](#), revealed a 68.05% error rate.
- Live testimony of poll workers, postal workers (who clandestinely transported ballots or were told to change postmark dates), voters, forensic experts, IT experts, mathematical statistics experts and more. Many testified in [Arizona](#), [Georgia](#), [Michigan](#), [Nevada](#), [Pennsylvania](#), and [Wisconsin](#). Most signed legal affidavits, under penalty of perjury, confirming their testimony to be true.
- [Liz Harris presented various pieces of evidence in Arizona](#) of discrepancies in voter rolls and those allowed to vote. These same concerns have been investigated, and evidence found, in several other states as well.
- Impossible statistical anomalies occurred, such as vote spikes delivering more votes than can physically be put through machines in the corresponding length of time, large batches (in the hundreds) showing up all for one candidate and “fractional” votes tabulated and recorded. (How do you get a fraction of a vote?) Examples of these are found in the [MI forensic audit](#); vote spike diagrams for [Arizona](#), [Georgia](#), [Wisconsin](#), and [Michigan](#); and in Sidney Powell’s [court filings](#).

Section 4: The Roles of Elected Officials (regarding the election)

Our founding fathers predicted situations in which elections might encounter fraudulent or unfair actions, and they brilliantly crafted our US Constitution to provide a solution to such an incident. It may well come into play as Congress gathers on January 6 to officially certify the election, and it is not without precedent. It was done in [Thomas Jefferson's election in 1800](#) and was [proceduralized in 1887](#). In brief, here are the roles of key parties to the election process:

State Legislators:

- Per Article II, Section 1 of the [US Constitution](#) (in part): *Each State shall appoint, in such Manner as the **Legislature** thereof may direct, a Number of Electors, equal to the whole Number of Senators and Representatives to which the State may be entitled in the Congress: but no Senator or Representative, or Person holding an Office of Trust or Profit under the United States, shall be appointed an Elector.*
- In the US there is not a single election, but 50 separate elections (one in each state), to be governed by State Legislatures who establish the laws of election procedure (example: mail-in balloting rules, how people may vote, what ID is necessary, etc).
- State Legislators also direct the selection of Electors who cast votes in the Electoral College, responsible for casting ballots on behalf of their state.
- In this case, the contention is that State Legislators certified election results that are fraudulent and, therefore, not representative of the results the citizens of the state voted.

Governors:

- Governors also “sign off” on the certified elections of his/her state. In this case, the contention is that Governors signed off on election results despite the fact significant evidence exists to warrant an investigation and full forensic audit of the voting records and machines.
- Governors in each of the contested states signed off on the elections of their state without considering potential fraud or investigating allegations.

Maricopa County (AZ) Board of Supervisors:

- The BOS has possession of voting records and machines from Maricopa County, the largest county in Arizona, and which utilized Dominion voting machines.
- In mid-December, following a Senate Judiciary Committee hearing, significant evidence was presented to cause the Committee to request and serve a subpoena upon the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors to release voting records and machinery. To date, they have ignored the subpoena and refuse to release the records and machinery.

US Senators and Representatives:

- On January 6, Congress will meet in joint session (Senators and Representatives together) to officially consider Electoral Ballots submitted by each state. Their role is to certify that the ballots represent the will of the people.
- If at least one Representative and one Senator stand to object to the Electoral Ballots, both chambers (Senate and House of Representatives) will split to debate the issue and perhaps demand a vote to choose the President of the United States.
- Each state will have 1 vote and, in case of a tie, the Vice President of the United States (who is also President of the Senate) will cast the deciding vote.

Section 5: The Message

Here is how to make your voice heard, and how to convey the message:

1. First and foremost: PRAY!
 - a. As believer in Jesus Christ, we know that God sits on the throne, and will continue to, regardless of outcome! But our fervent prayers have great power and produce wonderful results! ([James 5:16](#))
 - b. Our nation is blessed when we make God our Lord! ([Psalm 33:12](#))
 - c. Scripture tells us to expose deeds of darkness ([Ephesians 5:11](#)), and to rid ourselves of the deeds of darkness ([Romans 13:12](#)).
 - d. We are to prepare for battle, though the victory belongs to the Lord! ([Proverbs 21:31](#))
 - e. Remember: justice will ultimately prevail! ([Psalm 94:15](#))
 - f. Thank Him for privilege of living in the greatest nation on earth, and ask Him to grant wisdom and courage to those in our government who must now make very difficult decisions. Ask Him to season your words to elected officials with grace. Thank Him in advance for His mercy and lovingkindness and commit that you will trust Him in all things and in all circumstances.
2. Contact your elected officials. At this point, a call is better than an email.
 - a. Thank them for their service. Remember, they have a job to do and, though you may or may not agree with them, it is our responsibility to honor those who represent us.
 - b. Remind them that, as elected officials, they are to accurately represent their constituents, and guarding the integrity of elections is foundational to our Constitutional Republic.
 - c. It is okay to disagree, but voice your opposition with grace, though firmly. In some cases, they acted in alignment with the will of the people. If that is true, encourage them to continue to stand strong.
 - d. Contact State Legislators – brief talking points:
 - i. It is the responsibility of state legislators to govern over elections, and there has been a failure, at least in some states.
 - ii. Laws and regulations vary from state-to-state, so ask your legislators to do everything in their power to right the wrong in premature certification of elections that did not reflect the peoples’ intent.
 - iii. Ask them specifically to appeal to their Governor to de-certify their state’s election results.
 - e. Contact your Governor – brief talking points:
 - i. Your governor’s responsibility was to ensure the election results of his/her state reflected the will of the people.
 - ii. Without a full investigation, that cannot be guaranteed.
 - iii. Your governor (in the 6 contested states) failed to consider the potential of disenfranchised voters whose votes were, in essence, nullified by fraudulent votes.
 - iv. Remind your governor that he/she is responsible to the citizens of the state to represent their interests, and that did not occur because he/she did not consider the evidence.
 - v. Ask your governor to immediately de-certify the election results of your state.
 - f. In Arizona, contact the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors – brief talking points:

- i. The BOS contends the election results in Maricopa County were fair and clean, despite significant evidence that indicates otherwise.
- ii. They have refused actual audits of the voting records and are now refusing to respond to a legal subpoena to turn over records and voting machines to the AZ Senate Judiciary Committee.
- iii. Remind them there is one way to get the citizens of Arizona to stop calling and emailing them: release the voting records and machines.
- iv. Firmly ask them to release the records and machines immediately.
- g. Contact US Senators and Representatives – brief talking points:
 - i. Remind them they are representatives of the will of the people, and that there is significant doubt as to the validity of this election to certify results.
 - ii. Ask them to physically stand in the joint session of Congress and oppose the Electoral Ballots that do not represent the will of the people.
 - iii. Ask them to fight for our Constitutional Republic by considering the evidence of fraud and refrain from certification unless/until voting records and machines in each contested state undergo a forensic audit.
 - iv. Remind them that election integrity is at stake and it is not okay to “kick the can down the road.” We need resolution to THIS election.
