Israel College of the Bible invites you to join a study tour in which you will both tour the land of the Bible and meet with various sectors of society in modern Israel.

Your understanding of the Bible and your perspective on the current Middle East will be enriched by this life-changing tour.

### **DAY-BY-DAY SCHEDULE**

	Feb. 17 (Friday)	Those choosing to join the group flight from Phoenix, depart for your transatlantic flight	Enroute
1	Feb. 18 (Saturday)	Arrive in Tel Aviv. Transfer to your hotel in Samaria.	Eshel Hashomron Hotel, Ariel or similar





2 Feb. 19 (Sunday)

Visit a **factory** in the nearby industrial zone to learn about Israeli-Palestinian coexistence in the workplace. Visit **Shiloh** (including the audio-visual), where the tabernacle stood in the days of the Judges and Hannah prayed for a son (I Sam 1-3). Tour **Mt. Gerizim** (John 4), stopping at the Samaritan Museum (John 4) and enjoying a panoramic view over the Palestinian city of Nablus (biblical Shechem). In the late afternoon enjoy a stroll through the **Biblical Garden** at the hotel, which reminds us of various Biblical events that happened in Samaria. After dinner there will be an opportunity to view the **night show at the model of the Tabernacle** in the hotel garden.

Eshel Hashomron Hotel, Ariel or similar

**3** Feb. 20 (Monday)

Begin the day with a **panoramic view** over the coastal plain from the hills of Samaria, to learn about the strategic advantage of holding the heights above Tel Aviv. Tour the **Israel College of the Bible** and **ONE FOR ISRAEL** media studios. Hear the testimonies of Jewish and Arab staff members. Head north along the Mediterranean coast to visit **Caesarea** – Herod's magnificent port city, where the centurion Cornelius heard the good news (Acts 10) and Paul gave his defense before the Roman rulers and King Agrippa II (Acts 24 and 26).

Haifa, Colony Hotel or similar

4 Feb. 21 (Tuesday)

Visit the ICEJ **home for Holocaust Survivors**. Continue to **Mt. Carmel** where the Prophet Elijah had a contest with the prophets of Baal (I Kings 18). Tour the archaeological ruins of the ancient town of **Megiddo**, a key city which Solomon fortified. Stop in **Nazareth** for a panoramic view over the city and a **meeting with a local Arab pastor**.

Sea of Galilee, Nof Ginosar or similar





**5** Feb. 22 (Wed)

Visit sites connected with the ministry of Jesus around the Sea of Galilee, such as the archaeological excavations at **Magdala**, a Jewish town with a synagogue from the first century; **Tabgha**, to remember the breakfast on the beach following the resurrection (John 21) and **Capernaum**, a Jewish fishing town which became Jesus' ministry base. Share a **fish lunch** together by the Sea of Galilee (included) and then **sail on the Sea of Galilee**. See the remains of the 1st century AD fishing boat that has become known as the "**Jesus Boat**". Enjoy a panoramic view of the lake from the **Mount of Beatitudes**.

6 Feb 23 (Thursday)

Visit the northern border, with a stop at **Misgav Am**, with its impressive view into Lebanon. Meet with soldiers guarding the border there. Tour **Tel Dan**, one of the two alternative sites of worship built by King Jeroboam. for a view into Lebanon. Tour **Caesarea Philippi** (Matt 16:13ff) and then ascend the **Golan Heights** for a view into Syria and time of teaching/prayer.

Sea of Galilee, Nof Ginosar or similar

7 Feb. 24 (Friday)

Travel down the Jordan Valley, stopping at the Decapolis city of **Scythopolis** (Biblical Beth Shean), with its impressive Roman/Byzantine ruins. Descend to the **Dead Sea** the lowest point on earth. Pass Jericho and the area of the Judean Wilderness where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered. Visit the oasis of **Ein Gedi** (1 Sam 24 – David hides from Saul) and explore Herod's spectacular mountain fortress, **Masada**. There will be an opportunity to float in the **Dead Sea**. Then UP TO JERUSALEM! We'll have our first view over the city from **Mt**. **Scopus**.

Sergei Palace, Jerusalem, or similar





Travel to **Bethlehem** where we'll visit the "**Shepherds**' 8 Feb. 25 Sergei Palace, Jerusalem, or (Saturday) Fields" and also meet with a Palestinian pastor to learn about similar his ministry and pray for his congregation. Time permitting there will be a visit to a local **olive wood shop.** Travel through the Judean Hill Country to the Valley of David and Goliath. Visit Emmaus (Acts 24). Attend service at a local congregation led Dr. Seth Postell of the Israel College of the Bible. On the way back to Jerusalem, stop at **Yad Hashmonah**, a Messianic Jewish community in the Hill country. Feb. 26 Ascend **Temple Mount**, the site of the two temples. Tour the 9

9 Feb. 26 (Sunday)

Ascend **Temple Mount**, the site of the two temples. Tour the excavations around the **Southern Steps** of Temple Mount and the learn about pilgrimage to Jerusalem at the time of Jesus in the **Davidson Center**. Visit the **City of David**, including **Hezekiah's water tunnel** [or the (dry) Canaanite Tunnel], the **Pool of Siloam**, and the audio visual.

Sergei Palace, Jerusalem, or similar

Feb 27 (Monday)

Visit Yad Vashem, the Holocaust Memorial Museum, where we'll be privileged to have a local guide show us through the main museum. Visit the model of Second Temple Period Jerusalem at the Israel Museum and the Dead Sea Scrolls exhibit. Have a time of prayer over the city at a one of Jerusalem's prayer centers (Succat Hallel). In the evening, there will be an optional evening excursion to the amazing Sound and Light Show at the Tower of David.

Sergei Palace, Jerusalem, or similar





Feb. 28 (Tuesday)

Say farewell to the city with a panoramic view from **the Mount of Olives**, the location of Jesus' ascent and return, and **Dominus Flevit** where He wept over the city of Jerusalem (Luke 19:41-44). Spend time at the **Garden of Gethsemane** where Jesus prayed His last prayer with His disciples. Tour the archaeological remains in **St. Peter in Gallicantu** to remember the trial of Jesus before Caiaphas and then visit the **Garden Tomb**, a peaceful place to reflect of the crucifixion and resurrection of the Lord. The rest of the afternoon is free to visit **Mahane Yehuda market** or browse the **Old City Bazaars**. We'll have a farewell dinner together and then transfer to the

#### **BOOKINGS AND RATES**

- This tour requires a minimum of 25 paying participants for the quoted prices to be available. In case of less passengers, notification will be given regarding the increase in price per passenger (alternatively, the tour will be cancelled or the itinerary and/or hotels will be altered.)
- Please do not book your flights until "guaranteed departure" for the tour is confirmed.
- Changes can occur in hotels due to factors beyond our control, as well as changes in price due to exchange rate fluctuations.
- If a roommate cannot be assigned or is not wanted, single-room rates will apply.
- A non-refundable deposit of \$200 per person, paid online, to Israel College of the Bible is required to secure
  registration. You will be directed to the payment site at the end of registration. In the case that the tour
  needs to be cancelled due to lack of minimum participants (on the day that registration closes) your deposit
  will be fully refunded.

#### **PAYMENT AND CANCELLATION PENALTIES**

- Final Payment should be made by Dec 17, 2022
- 50 % of total tour cost will be charged if you cancel after Jan. 3, 2023.
- 100 % of total tour cost will be charged if cancellation occurs after Feb. 2, 2023.

### **DOCUMENTS**

A passport valid for at least **six months after returning home** is required. It is the passenger's responsibility to obtain, at their own expense, the documents required to enter Israel according to citizenship. In addition, the Israeli government may require COVID19-related documentation and testing (currently only proof of medical insurance valid in Israel is required).
